Grounded in the Developmental Model of Intercultural Sensitivity (DMIS), the IDI[®] has been successfully used since 1998 in corporate, academic, and other settings to aid individual coaching and action-planning, to guide real and virtual multicultural team development, to generate needs analyses for targeted training, and to conduct program evaluation, organizational development, diversity programs, and research efforts.
