The IDI[®] v.3 is customized for educational use and various organizational applications. The IDI[®] is translated into Bahasa Indonesia/Malay, Chinese, French, German, Italian, Japanese, Korean, Norwegian, Portuguese, Russian, and Spanish. Grounded in the Developmental Model of Intercultural Sensitivity (DMIS), the IDI[®] has been successfully used since 1998 in corporate, academic, and other settings to aid individual coaching and action-planning, to guide real and virtual multicultural team development, to generate needs analyses for targeted training, and to conduct program evaluation, organizational development, diversity programs, and research efforts.
